In the Eastern District of VA</b>	<p>Per Dr. Sherwood at DAC 12/05/2025 : Books being returned to libraries question- PAC EAST schools are the only one impacted, no other schools are impacted at this time.</p> <p>Dr. Sherwood will ask Ms. Rapp about if there is an internal process to address this, otherwise may need to participate in an additional court case to get the books returned- awaiting Dr. Sherwood's response. Follow up email sent 1/4/26.</p> <p>1/7/26 Dr. Sherwood's response: As noted, we know that the case listed only impacts and applies to the schools listed. <b>Dual Enrollment funding for students</b>	<p>Request for updates or guidance regarding homeschool or auxiliary students' participation in DoDEA's dual credit program that will authorize up to \$1500 funded credits under the FY 2026 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA).</p> <p>DoDEA HQ is aware of this request and we are waiting for the specific policies and procedures to be disseminated.</p>	Motion to elevate to DAC to ensure all command sponsored have access to enrollment	No Vote
<b>Portion sizes and healthy meals for middle school students</b>	<p>What pathway exists to elevate concerns about portion sizes and meals for students? The middle-school students are fed less than the high school students and, while the calorie count may be high because it's processed and dense, kids are NOT anywhere close to feeling full. Coming here command sponsored meant losing an entire half our income. We depend on the lunch and breakfast programs here to help our kids get enough to eat.</p> <p>Possible solution: Allow off-base meal services that match what the Korean students get. They have excellent fresh meals that are healthy and filling.</p> <p>Ms. Bryant has reached out to AAFEES to determine how, in the MHS setting, cafeteria workers know who is HS and who is MS. . Mrs. Kersey shared AAFEES response to similar, but not identical, questions raised by Misawa SAC</p> <p>“ Misawa AB, Japan Concerns:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The 6<sup>th</sup> graders pay more than the rest of the Sollars Elementary School students – even though they receive the same portion sizing. <b>The nutrition guidelines for 6-8 grades is more than elementary schools. Additionally, it is a unit price which allows students to choose what they wish which costs less than charging a la carte.</b></li> <li>2. How much extra do students pay to receive a 'second lunch' (if they are still hungry after the first portion)? <b>A complete second lunch would be charged at the non-reimbursable meal rate which is \$7.50. However, we offer a "Lunch Plus" which is the entrée of the day for \$2.25 – for example, a second hamburger.</b></li> <li>3. What guidelines does AAFES follow to dictate portion sizing? – Can this be reevaluated to reflect the activity/athletic level that many of the high school students are exuding each day? <b>We follow the National School Lunch Program; nutritional guidelines including portion sizes are found in the CFR. <a href="https://www.ecfr.gov/current/title-7/section-210.10">https://www.ecfr.gov/current/title-7/section-210.10</a> While it may be beneficial for athletes to receive additional nutrients; however, the guidelines are established by the Dietary Guidelines for Americans and based on average nutrient requirements for all students in that grade level. For example, a petite female in 9<sup>th</sup> grade has different nutrient requirements than a muscular male athlete in 12<sup>th</sup> grade.</b></li> <li>4. What limitations does AAFES have regarding food quality and variation? (Is it possible to have more menu item variety each week? – not looking for more than 3 choices per day, but for the monthly menu to contain newer items) (What limitations are in place for Misawa Air Base to receive higher quality food/fruits/veggies?) <b>We source our fresh produce from local suppliers to ensure quality. All menus are designed to meet the nutritional standards set by the USDA National School Meal Program, including limits on calories, sodium, fat, and sugar.</b></li> </ol>	Motion to elevate to IAC to get official AAFEES policy on food allotted	Yes - Unanimous

	<p>Our menu follows a four-week cycle, offering three meal options each day to provide variety and choice. To help offset meal costs, we utilize USDA commodity credits, which require us to order specific products directly from the US. Most of the foods we purchase are Buy American eligible, meaning they contribute to supporting American agriculture. In addition, our menus are used in several regions around the world; the food is shipped to four different Distribution Centers (DCs). Once the food arrives, we must be able to use the inventory in a timely manner. We value input from our students and community and welcome suggestions for future menus. Be sure to watch for our annual survey, typically published each January. We read every single survey comment and implement as many suggestions as possible.</p> <p>5. Can AAFES partner with local Japanese vendors for fresher ingredients? <a href="#">See above</a>”</p>		
<p><b>WIFI access during extracurricular travel</b></p>	<p>As a parent of a student athlete I would like to understand why our teams when traveling don't have access to the hosting schools WiFi/internet.</p> <p>Students traveling have zero ability to work on school work or communicate with parents while traveling internationally or for the Far East.</p> <p>Ms. Bryant has reached out to various schools in our region and they have all confirmed that students can access the wifi. Students can access the wifi at DoDEA schools with DODEA distributed devices. Please ask your student and if we can identify a school/schools where they've experienced a problem we can reach back out.</p>	<p>No action taken</p>	<p>No Vote</p>
<p><b>Coaching</b></p>	<p>New request- Hiring the most knowledgeable coaches possible to give our kids the best opportunities we can given the challenges of being overseas. Coaches with a background in a sport will also protect against injuries. Coaches need to know what drills to do and how to do them safely.</p> <p><i>SAC Chair note- I believe this can be rolled into the old business working group set up, but wanted to include it for the team's situational awareness.</i></p>	<p>Not Discussed</p>
